Diagnostic tests crucial before antibiotics — new NMC norms seek to check rise in antibiotic resistance

No antibiotics for patients before diagnostic tests and limiting empiric antibiotic therapy, when the pathogen is unidentified, to seriously ill patients — these are some of the recommendations by the National Medical Commission (NMC) to faculties and senior residents in medical colleges across India.

In its bid to check the rise in antibiotic resistance, the NMC — the regulator for medical education and doctors — emphasised prescribing appropriate antibiotics or antimicrobials to patients based on clinical evaluation and most likely pathogens. The regulator sent its 156-page guidelines —

Japan launches advanced Earth observation satellite on its new flagship H3 rocket

Japan deployed an upgraded Earth observation satellite for disaster response and security after it was launched on a new flagship H3 rocket Monday.

The H3 No. 3 rocket lifted off from the Tanegashima Space Centre on a southwestern Japanese island and released its payload about 16 minutes later as planned, the Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency, or JAXA, said during a livestream.

The Advanced Land Observation Satellite, or ALOS-4, is tasked primarily with Earth observation and data collection for disaster response and mapping.

Did you know



The National Library is under Ministry of Culture, Government of India. The library is designated to collect, disseminate and preserve printed material produced within India. With a collection in excess of **2.5 million books and records**, it is the **largest in the country**. The origins of the National Library, Kolkata begins with the establishment of Calcutta Public Library on **21st March 1836**.



The Imperial Secretariat Library came into existence in 1981 by integrating all Secretariat Libraries. In the year 1902, the Calcutta Public Library and the Imperial Secretariat Library were amalgamated and gave way to the establishment of The Imperial Library.



After Independence of India, the National Library came into being in place of Imperial Library by the "Imperial Library (Change of Name) Act" in 1948. It was accorded a special status of an Institution of National Importance in the **Article 62 in the 7th Schedule of the Constitution of India** and was opened to Public on 1st February 1953.




Orientation for New Users by Central Library, AIIMS Bathinda


