


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# Organisation Structure of AIIMS Bathinda





#### **Background and Spirit of AllMS Bathinda**

AIIMS Bathinda has been raised under the Central Sector Scheme, Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY), which was first announced in August 2003 with the primary objective of correcting the regional imbalances in availability of affordable/reliable tertiary level healthcare in the country in general, and to augment facilities for quality medical education in under-served or backward States, in particular. Hence 21 New AIIMS Projects have been conceptualised under PMSSY.

#### 2. Vision:

- (a) Ensuring specialty-based, evidence-based, equity-driven and state-ofthe-art patientcare to the Malwa region of Punjab and adjoining states with a focus on regional diseases and health issues;
- (b) Create an excellent academic and educational environment for providing a platform for development of quality medical services, teaching, and research.
- (c) Achieve an exemplary quality in medical education delivery and training and to render International standard quality patient care and health care.

#### 3. Objectives of AIIMS Bathinda:

- (a) To develop a pattern of teaching in undergraduate and postgraduate medical education so as to demonstrate high standard of medical education to all medical colleges and other allied institutions in India.
- (b) To bring together in one place educational facilities of the highest order for the training of medical and paramedical health personnel
- (c) To attain self-sufficiency in postgraduate in medical education.



As a vital pillar of healthcare delivery at this esteemed institution, our department has strived to uphold the highest standards of excellence.

- a. Patient-Centric Care: Over the past year, we have continued to prioritize patient safety, comfort, and optimal outcomes. Our specialized anaesthesia services have supported a wide range of surgical interventions, including neurosurgery, cardiovascular surgeries, complex major abdominal and urological surgeries. For Cesarean sections, the department provides tailored anaesthesia options, promoting pain-free deliveries, and also caters to high risk pregnancies including placenta accreta spectrum, severe preeclampsia and heart diseases. In neurosurgery, our expertise shines during aneurysm and tumour surgeries, with a focus on intracranial pressure management. For cardiovascular and thoracic surgeries, including congenital heart defects and CABG, precise hemodynamic control and anaesthesia maintenance are paramount. In major abdominal surgeries, anaesthesia is tailored to facilitate early recovery after surgery, with special emphasis on management of post-operative pain. We have consistently delivered pain management solutions tailored to each patient's unique needs, ensuring their well-being throughout their surgical journey whilst practicing concepts of Enhanced Recovery after Surgery (ERAS).

### 2. Brief Introduction of the department:

The department of Burns & Plastic Surgery at the All-India Institute of Medical Sciences Bathinda Punjab was established in July 2021 with the joining of Dr. M. Altaf Mir as Associate Professor on 27th of July 2021. Then Dr. Rajesh K Maurya joined as Assistant Professor on 2nd of August 2021.

The Department is rapidly increasing the spectrum of reconstruction and undertaking the major reconstruction surgeries in head and neck cancer patients, hand and lower limb injuries, post skin malignancy defects, oculoplastic surgery, and almost all the congenital and acquired defects and deformity of anatomical body parts.

Micro-vascular tissue transfers like free Flaps; repair of nerve and vessel injuries, Brachial plexus surgery and lymphedema surgery is being routinely done. Corrective surgeries and rehabilitation of post burn deformity, post burn scarring and limb deformity is done. Pediatric Congenital deformity like syndactyly, polydactyly, hypospadias, cleft lip-palate, club hand is being corrected. Aesthetic Surgeries like otoplasty, rhinoplasty, abdominoplasty, breast reduction, gynecomastia correction, and scar revision are being done. Minor surgical procedure room has been set up in the outpatient clinic and in Burns & Plastic Surgery Ward. The Department is planning to establish micro vascular training lab for teaching and training of residents and establishment of dedicated 20 bedded Burn unit with modern facilities with HDU and dedicated Burn OT for care of Acute Burn patients in near future.

The Department has already approval for admission for One M.Ch. superspecialist seat per session (semester) and post-doctoral certificate course (PDCC) two seats per year. The department is planning to start short (3 month) and long (6 month) observership courses in Hand and Brachial Plexus surgery, and Maxillofacial surgery in near future.



### 2. Brief Introduction of the department:

The Department at present is offering OPD services as well as Cardiac, Thoracic and Vascular surgery procedures. The Department will offer complex Cardiac, Thoracic and Vascular procedures with gratifying results at par with the current international standards. The main focus of interest is to perform complex aortic reconstructive surgeries, thoracic organ transplantation, uniportal video-assisted as well as robotic-assisted uniportal surgeries with excellent outcomes.

#### A. SERVICES

### (a) Out patient Department (OPD)

The majority of the patients are referrals from adjoining areas of Punjab, Haryana and other states. The complex cardiac problems, unresolved vascular pathologies, lung sequale secondary to tuberculosis, malignancy, interstitial disease and chest deformities constitute most patients coming to the OPD.

### (b) Services offered by the Department





### 2. Brief Introduction of the department:

- (a) Vision- The department aspires to develop an Integrated Resource Centre for patient care, teaching, training and high-quality research with a focus on preventive, promotive and curative health care. It envisages to develop a policy framework based on evidence-based medicine and research to address key public health issues or diseases.

# 2. Brief Introduction of the department:

- (a) OUTPATIENT SERVICE: Medicine OPD had been one of the busiest OPDs of our institute catering to all sorts of patients from in and around Bathinda. ## 5. Brief Introduction of the department:

We have started Haemodialysis services since 8<sup>th</sup> of October 2022. So far more than 2000 Haemodialysis sessions have been undertaken. Continuous renal replacement therapy (CRRT) is also functional in the unit and so far 12 patients have undergone successful CRRT in critically ill state in various ICUs. We are also providing bedside Slow Low Efficiency Dialysis in all the four ICUs AIIMS, Bathinda have. Plasmapharesis is being conducted in Dialysis unit for Gullian Barre Syndrome, CIDP, AMSAN, Myasthenia gravis, and severe acute hepatitis. SO far more than 200 sessions of Plasmapharesis sessions have been conducted successfully. Our Interventional Nephrology program is on full swing. We have conducted Hands-on Workshop of CAPD catheter insertion where in DM students from various neighbouring medical colleges have participated. We also provide Dialysis access creation to CKD end stage patients viz. Tunnelled cuffed catheter placement, CAPD catheter placement, AVF creation, Femoral Catheter placement and Access correction surgeries. We have performed 350 Kidney Biopsies since the initiation of nephrology services (Sept 2021). We have provided technical inputs to initiate Pradhan mantri National Dialysis Programme- CAPD to DMRE, State of Punjab.



#### 2. Brief Introduction of the department:

The Department of Psychiatry started functioning after the inauguration of the outpatient services at AIIMS, Bathinda w.e.f. 23-12-2020. The manpower at the time of inception of psychiatry OPD consisted of four faculty members namely Dr Gurvinder Pal Singh as prof and HOD, Dr. Jitender Aneja, Additional Professor and Dr. Bharat Udey, Assistant Professor. Dr. Jawahar Singh Assistant Profesor

Broadly we are catering to children, adolescents, adults and elderly patients with psychological issues or psychiatric disorders, substance use disorders and sexual disorders. In our outdoor clinic we are serving to patients with common mental disorders, severe mental illness, psychosomatic disorders, stress related problems, childhood disorders, geriatric problems, substance use disorders, marital and psychosexual disorders etc. We are seeing new patients as well as referred patients from other departments of AIIMS Bathinda and outside. We are providing pharmacotherapy, and psychological testing (presently limited) and therapies like psychoeducation, behavioral therapy, psychotherapy, abreaction treatments and teaching various relaxation exercises.

Special clinics being run are: Drug Deaddiction Clinic (DDC) (Tuesday), Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Clinic (CAPC) (Monday), Geriatric Mental Health Clinic (GMHC) (Wednesday), Marital & Psychosexual Clinic (MPC; Wednesday), and Mindfulness clinic (Friday).

The department offers complex abdominal surgeries with outcomes at par with the current international standards. Minimally invasive (laparoscopic) surgery and Gastrointestinal (GI) cancers are two areas of particular emphasis for the department. The faculty is well-versed in performing complex laparoscopic procedures; it is the preferred approach for most surgeries for non-cancerous and cancerous diseases. We intend to become a center of excellence for laparoscopic surgeries and promote safe laparoscopic surgery training among the surgeons in Punjab and adjoining states. The department will undertake capacity building and training of Surgeons in the adjoining areas to ensure safe surgical practices and timely referral of needy patients. The institute started on 23rd December 2019 with OPD services. The OPD services have been growing steadily with the focus on quality health care services. Faculty has been recruited in many broad specialties.

#### **Registration Desk**

The real time HMIS streamlines the treatment flow of patients and simultaneously empowering workforce to perform to their peak ability, in an optimized and efficient manner. It is modeled on the unique combination of a 'patient centric and medical staff centric' paradigm, thus providing benefits to both the recipients and the providers of healthcare. It ensures dramatic improvement in performance along with reducing the costs. A data warehouse of such records can be utilized for statistical requirements and for research.

The HMIS ensures that users do not spend hours in patient registration and lab tests. Hospital HMIS system generates a unique ID for every new patient registration and lab samples. Patients OPD slip has a unique ID on it and only takes seconds to scan and offer hospital services like revisits, billing, pharmacy services etc. Each patient after OPD registration moves to vital examination desk. On the vital examination desk trained health personnel who measure pulse, respiration and blood pressure of patients.

Multi-specialty OPD services aim to providing patient centric care were started in the specialty areas of General Medicine, Surgery, Gynecology& Obstetrics, Orthopedics, ENT, Ophthalmology, Dermatology, Psychiatry, Dentistry, Radiotherapy, and Anesthesiology which are functioning from Monday to Saturday. The clinics focus on the preventive, promotive and curative aspect of health care services on an outpatient basis. Immunization clinic has also been started with support from the state Government to provide vaccines under the Universal Immunization Program by Government of India.

The hospital brings together some of the most talented medical professionals in the country and has a dedicated team of clinicians to provide highest standards of patient care. There is provision of consultation chambers where patients are provided medical, surgical or allied consultation, examination and expert opinion, Day care rooms where patients can be examined for any disease condition.

The OPD is supported by basic diagnostics in radiology, biochemistry, pathology, and microbiology and sample collection points have been provided. Pharmacy provides medications to the patients. The biomedical waste management at AIIMS Bathinda has been out sourced.



























#### LABORATORY SERVICES



Institutional ethical committee of AIIMS Bathinda was registered on 6-10-2020 with CDSCO & also registered with DHR & NECRBHR on 19-11-2020. **5**<sup>th</sup> **meeting** of the Institutional Ethical Committee was held on 19-7-2022 at Conference Room, AIIMS Bathinda, in which a total of 16 STS projects were discussed, out of which 10 STS projects were approved and 5 were approved subject to modifications, 1 STS project was approved subject to permission for using mentioned scales; **6**<sup>th</sup> **IEC meeting** was held on 3-10-2022 in which a total of 29 research projects (faculty) and 44 PGs projects were discussed out of faculty projects discussed, 19 faculty projects were approved, 8 were approved subject to modifications and 2 research projects were asked to resubmit again to IEC after major modifications.



7th IEC meeting was held on 3-3-2023, in which a total of 38 research projects were discussed, out of which 17 research projects were approved and 21 were approved subject to modifications.








Website screenshot providing the details of the Hospital services & ORS


(iv) eSanjeevani OPD: - A doctor to patient telemedicine system has been deployed nationally by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare under Ayushman Bharat Scheme of Government of India. The scheme is particularly useful during times of pandemic Covid-19 as it helps people avoid going out to consult a doctor or visit a hospital. Through eSanjeevani OPD, anyone can seek medical advice and medication through audio and video. With the introduction ofthis service, people living in the remotest areas will also be able to get their health-related consultation. AIIMS Bathinda started Teleconsultation using portal eSanjeevani OPD. Admin Panel in which newentries of doctors for various departments, record updation is maintained by IT Cell



(v) Online OPD Registration: - Online Registration System (ORS) is a framework to link various hospitals across the country for Aadhaar based online registration and appointment system where counter based OPD registration and appointment system through Hospital Management Information System (HMIS) has been digitalized. Portal facilitates online appointments with various departments of different Hospitals using eKYC data of Aadhaar number if patient's mobile number is registered with UIDAI. And in case the mobile number is not registered with UIDAI it uses patient's name. New Patients will get appointment as well as Unique Health Identification (UHID) number. If Aadhaar number is already linked with UHID number, then appointment number will be given and UHID will remain the same.



(vi) AIIMS Bathinda started online appointment using ORS portal. Admin Panel in which new entries of doctors for various departments, OPD schedule, record updation is maintained by IT Cell.



- 8) **Network:** AIIMS Bathinda signed MoU with the National Knowledge Network (NKN) for the internet connectivity and 1 GBPS internet link is working in AIIMS Bathinda. OIC IT is the nodal officer and IT Cell is coordinating with the NKN regarding the network related works. BSNL also serves as both the ISP and PRI provider, with the IT Cell serving as the nodal department and also overseeing day-to-day coordination with the relevant department for related tasks.
- 9) Firewall & Network Devices: The IT Cell is responsible for the management and oversight of critical network devices, including firewalls, ISRs, PRIME, and WLC, as well as essential systems like CCTV, Nurse Call, and IDS. IT Cell ensures the seamless operation of network services by handling configuration and policy-based tasks.
- 10)Biometric Register: The IT Cell has successfully engineered a specialized software application with the primary purpose of converting the raw data generated by our biometric machines into a format compatible with our biometric register system. This innovative solution streamlines the process of recording and managing biometric data, making it more accessible and convenient for administrative purposes. By seamlessly integrating raw data into the biometric register, this application enhances the efficiency of record-keeping procedures.
- 11) Email Services: AIIMS Bathinda is using NIC Email services under the domain 'AIIMSbathinda.edu.in'. OIC IT is the nodal officer for the same and IT Cell is operating admin panel of NIC Email services. Services like creation of new email account, deactivation of account etc. along with the renewal of VPN and email services subscription is operated and maintained by the IT Cell. Additionally, Google workspace services under the domain 'AIIMSbathinda.in' is subscripted by the AIIMS Bathinda from Google and google email services along with the admin panel is also managed and operated by the IT Cell.



- **12) Video Conferencing (VC) Room**: Set up for the video conferencing is installed in ground floor of Medical College, AIIMS Bathinda by IT Cell using various devices such as LED Display (12\*6 Feet), Video EndPoint, Microphones etc. Administration is using this VC room for videos conferences such as meetings, lectures, interviews on various platforms like google meet, cisco Webex, Zoom, Microsoft Teams etc.

#### Introduction:

All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Bathinda (Punjab) is a Central autonomous body under aegis of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare under PMSSY Division. A Gazette Notification was issued on 04th Dec 2019 for establishment of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences at Bathinda in Punjab. The Government of Punjab transferred land measuring 175 acres to the Central Government in Nov, 2016 for establishment of AIIMS Bathinda.

The PGIMER, Chandigarh was the mentor institute of AIIMS, Bathinda and the OPD/IPD services of the Institute have been started.

#### 1. Accounting Convention

The books of accounts of All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Bathinda (Punjab) have been maintained on the basis of Accrual basis of Accounting.

#### 2. Inventory Valuation

The Inventory of the Institute i.e. stores & spares consumables has been valued at cost price. The costs have been worked out on the First in First Out (FIFO) method.

#### 3. Fixed Assets

- 3.1. Fixed Assets are stated at historical cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental expenses relating to acquisition. In respect of projects involving construction, related pre-operational expenses (including interest on loans for specific project prior to its completion), form part of the value of the assets capitalized.
- 3.2. Fixed assets received by way of non-monetary grants (other than towards the Corpus Fund), are capitalized values stated, by corresponding credit to Capital Reserve.

#### 4. Depreciation

- 4.1. The depreciation has been provided in the books of accounts as per the W.D.V. method and rates specified are as per the Income Tax Act, 1961.
- 4.2. In respect of addition/deletion of assets during the year, are charged on half of the rate, where the addition/ deletion is less than six months and full rate of depreciation is charged, where the period exceeded six months. However assets related to the previous financial years, which requires to be capitalized in current financial year are taken into consideration with the accumulated depreciation in current year.

The provision for leave encashment and gratuity has been mentioned in contingent liabilities as on 31.03.2023.



- iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Bathinda (Panjab)in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- iv) We further report that: -

#### A. Balance Sheet

A.1 Corpus /Capital Fund and Liabilities
Current Liabilities & Provisions (Schedule 7)
Current Liabilities: ₹ 611.58 lakh

As per Rule 230 (8) of General Financial Rules (GFR) 2017, "All interest or other earnings against Grant in Aid or advance (other than reimbursement) released to any Grantee Institution should mandatory be remitted to the Consolidated Fund of India immediately after finalization of the accounts. Such advances should not be allowed to be adjusted against future releases"

It was pointed out in the previous year's Separate Audit Report for the year 2021-22 (comment No. A.1.1) that interest of ₹81.45 lakh earned on grant funds was incorrectly depicted as income instead of liability under Current Liabilities & Provisions. The Institute has still to remit this amount of interest to the Consolidated Fund of India. However, the same was not shown as liability in the annual accounts for the year 2022-23 despite being pointed out in the previous year. This has resulted in understatement of Current Liabilities and overstatement of Corpus/ Capital Fund by ₹81.45 lakh.

#### A.2 Assets

#### A.2.1 Fixed Assets (Schedule 8)

#### A.2.1.1 Plant & Machinery- NIL

The Institute has adopted the written down value (WDV) method of depreciation as per the rates specified under Income tax Act 1961. As per Income tax Act, depreciation rates for 'Plant & Machinery' and 'Buildings' are 15 percent per annum and 10 per annum respectively.

The Institute has included plant and machinery amounting to ₹ 51.61 crore under the head "Building" which has resulted in overstatement of Buildings by ₹ 46.45 crore (after depreciation at the rate of 10 percent per annum), understatement of Plant & Machinery by ₹ 43.87 crore, overstatement of Buildings by Rs. 46.45 crore and understatement depreciation by ₹2.58 crore.



#### A.2.1.2 Buildings:₹ 508.14 crore

Above included residential buildings of ₹ 46.76 erore. The Institute charged depreciation on these residential building at the rate of 10 percent annum (WDV method). However as per Income tax Act, applicable depreciation rate for residential buildings is 5 percent per annum. This has resulted in overstatement of depreciation and understatement of Buildings by ₹ 2.34 erore.

# A.2.2 Current Assets, Loan & Advances (Schedule 11) Advances and other amount recoverable in cash or kind or for value to be received On Capital Account-HITES Ltd Const.: ₹ 25.39 crore

Ministry of Health & Family Welfare is releasing funds directly to HLL Infra Tech Services Limited (HITES) for construction works and supply of equipment's to the Institute.

- (i) The Institute has shown advance pending for construction works amounting to ₹ 25.39 crore by including interest earned of ₹ 0.52 crore as advances to HITES as well as its income. As per Rule 230 (8) of General Financial Rules 2017, interest earned on Government grant funds is reimbursable to the Consolidated Funds of India. As such, interest earned by HITES amounting to ₹ 0.52 crore is reimbursable to the Consolidated Fund of India. This has resulted in overstatement of income and understatement of liabilities by ₹ 0.52 crore.
- (ii) Further, the above balance of advances amounting to ₹ 24.87 crore was also booked as addition to Corpus/ Capital Funds. However, as these funds of ₹ 24.87 crore have not utilized till 31.03.2023, these should have been shown under Earmarked/ Endowment Funds instead of Corpus/ Capital Funds. This has resulted in overstatement of Corpus/ Capital Fund and understatement of Earmarked/ Endowment Funds by ₹ 24.87 crore.
- (iii) Moreover, the Institute has not booked advance released directly by the Ministry to HITES amounting to ₹ 48.49 crore for supplying of equipment (s) to the Institute. This has resulted in understatement of Advances as well as Earmarked/ Endowment Funds by ₹ 48.49 crore.

#### B. Net impact of Audit comments on the Annual Accounts

Net impact of Audit comments on the annual accounts of the Institute for the year ending 31 March 2023 is as under:



- Assets understated by ₹48.25crore;
- ii. Liabilities understated by ₹ 74.69 crore;
- iii. Corpus/Capital Fund overstated by ₹26.44 crore. Besides, the surplus is overstated by ₹0.76 crore.

#### C. General

- C.1 The Institute has received 50 no. of oxygen gas cylinder fee of cost from Ministry of Health & Family Welfare on 09.12.22 having a value of ₹44.83 lakh. However, the same were not booked in Fixed Assets. The same are required to be shown in books of accounts.
- C.2 Ministry of Health & Family Welfare is releasing funds directly to HITES for construction works and supply of equipment's to the Institute. As per HITES statement, up to 31.03.2023, total amount of capital work in Progress was ₹ 44.76 crore (43.98¹ + 0.78² for supply of equipment (s) and construction works respectively). However, the Institute has booked the same at ₹ 84.70 crore. Reasons for the difference amount of 39.94 crore booked under Capital Work in Progress are to be reconciled by the Institute.
- C.3 Accounting policies regarding accounting treatment of HEFA Loan & assets acquired through it, advances released to HITES by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare on behalf of the Institute & assets acquired from HITES and policy regarding capitalisation of these assets were not declared through Significant Accounting Policies (Schedule 24).
- C.4 Under the AYUSHMAN Bharat Scheme, the govt. has fixed the limit of package in monetary terms. The Institute provides the treatment to Ayushman card holders free of cost by purchasing medicines & consumables at its own level which are reimbursed by the State Health Authority. Sometimes hospitals make excess expenditure over & above the package and sometime surplus lies with the Institute on the packages. The hospital has not disclosed the accounting treatment of such excess expenditure or surpluses in significant accounting policies. Further accounting treatment of payment to supplier for medicines/consumables as well reimbursement of payment was not disclosed.

- C.5 As per expenditure statement (Construction work) of HITES, an expenditure (Addition) of ₹ 13.99 crore was incurred during the year 2022-23. However, workwise details of expenditure of ₹ 13.99 crore were not furnished.
- C.6 As per Accounting Standard 15, provision for retirement benefits (gratuity, leave encashment etc.) should be made on actuarial valuation basis in the annual accounts.

As per the note at Sr. no. 10, the provision for leave encashment and gratuity has been mentioned in contingent liabilities as on 31.03.2023. However, no such provision has been depicted in contingent liabilities in the note at Sr. no.1. Thus, note at Sr. no. 10 contrary to the note at Sr. No. 1. Further the position regarding implementation of payment of gratuity act with reference to ministry of Education circular issued vide F.No. 19-1/2017-1 FD dated 27.01.2022 has not been disclosed in Notes to Accounts.

#### D. Grant-in-Aid

As per Schedule 3, out of total available funds of ₹165.05 crore including the unutilized balance of the previous year of ₹29.67³ crore and Grant-in-Aid received during the year ₹ 135.38 crore; the Institute utilized ₹ 154.26 crore leaving an unutilized balance of ₹ 10.79⁴ crore at the end the year. However, the negative balance of ₹ 14.10 crore (as pointed out in SAR 20-21) have been adjusted under the head 'Grant in Aid Salary'. If such negative balance was not adjusted against this year's grant, then the balance of grant in aid should have been ₹ 24.89 crore.

#### E. Management letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit report have been brought to the notice of the Institute's management through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

v) Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.

## B.1.2 Current Assets, Loan & Advances (Schedule 11) Advances and other amount recoverable in cash or kind or for value to be received

Others: ₹19.27 crore

Above did not include ₹ 14.33 lakh which is recoverable under AYUSHMAN BHARAT Scheme from State Health Authority (SHA) on account of expenses of medicines as on 31.03.23. This is further payable to M/sAmrit Pharmacy who had supplied these medicines. The amount was rejected by SHA at the first instance due to wanting of documents. This has resulted in understatement of Current Liabilities & Provisions as well as Current Assets, Loan and Advances by₹14.33 lakh.

#### B.2 General

As per the handing over/taking over Note of HITES, out of building amounting to ₹ 584.61 crore, the building of ₹ 86.81 crore were handed over on 23, December, 2019 and balance building were handed over in between the period 28 October 2020 to 31 march 2022.

However, an office order 16.02.2023 was issued by the Institute to shift the date of taking over of buildings as per the details given below:
