

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
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ORGANIZATION CHART







BACKGROUND AND SPIRIT OF AIIMS BATHINDA

 AIIMS Bathinda has been raised under the Central Sector Scheme, Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY), which was first announced in August 2003 with the primary objective of correcting the regional imbalances in availability of affordable/reliable tertiary level healthcare in the country in general, and to augment facilities for quality medical education in under-served or backward States, in particular. Hence 21 New AIIMS Projects have been conceptualised under PMSSY.

2. Vision.

- (a) Ensuring specialty-based, evidence-based, equity-driven and state-of-the-art patientcare to the Malwa region of Punjab and adjoining states with a focus on regional diseases and health issues.
- (b) Create an excellent academic and educational environment for providing a platform for development of quality medical services, teaching, and research.
- (c) Achieve an exemplary quality in medical education delivery and training and to render International standard quality patient care and health care.

3. **Objectives of AIIMS Bathinda**.

- (a) To develop a pattern of teaching in undergraduate and postgraduate medical education to demonstrate high standard of medical education to all medical colleges and other allied institutions in India.
- (b) To bring together in one place educational facilities of the highest order for the training of medical and paramedical health personnel.
- (c) To attain self-sufficiency in postgraduate in medical education.





2. **Brief Introduction of the department**.

(a) <u>Introduction</u>. All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) Bathinda has continued to advance its mission of providing high-quality medical education, research, and healthcare services. As the Dean of Academics, I am pleased to present the annual report for 2024-25, which highlights our accomplishments, initiatives, and future directions.

3. **ACADEMIC COURSES AND TRAINING PROGRAMMES.**

(a) **DM–MCh Courses**.

- (i) During the academic year 2024–25, DM–MCh programmes were offered in 13 departments, with new courses introduced in four departments.
- (ii) DM Courses were initiated in the departments of Forensic Medicine and Toxicology and Neurology, in addition to the existing DM programmes in Cardiology and Nephrology.
- (iii) MCh Courses were introduced in Surgical Gastroenterology and Gynaecologic Oncology, in addition to the existing MCh programmes in Cardiothoracic and Vascular Surgery (CTVS), Neurosurgery, Urology, Joint and Replacement Surgery, Hand and Microvascular Surgery, Paediatric Surgery, and Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery.

(b) MD (Hospital Administration) / DM (6 years) / MCh (6 years) Courses.

- (i) In addition to the existing MD/MS/MDS programmes in 22 departments, new MD (HA)/DM (6 years)/MCh (6 years) courses were started in five departments during 2024–25.
- (ii) The MD course in Hospital Administration was introduced.
- (iii) The MCh (6-year) programmes commenced in Paediatric Surgery, Neurosurgery, and Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery.



- (c) <u>MBBS Course</u>: A total of 100 students were admitted to the MBBS Batch 2024 during the academic session 2024–25. From the MBBS Batch 2020, 98 students successfully passed the Final Professional Examination and subsequently commenced their compulsory internship training at AIIMS Bathinda.
- (d) <u>B.Sc. MRI Technician Course</u>: The B.Sc. MRI Technician course was initiated in the year 2023 with an annual intake of 10 students. In the academic session 2024–25, 7 candidates were admitted to the course.
- (e) <u>Short-Term and Long-Term Training Programmes</u>: Students were admitted to Short-Term and Long-Term Training Courses (1–6 months duration) in various departments of AIIMS Bathinda, providing exposure to advanced clinical and research techniques as part of institutional training initiatives.



II. Brief Introduction of the department:

Academics and teaching:

The educational efforts are directed towards undergraduate & postgraduate teaching in gross anatomy, microscopic anatomy, embryology and neuroanatomy. II. Brief Introduction of the Department:

- (a) The department of Burns & Plastic Surgery at the All-India Institute of Medical Sciences, Bathinda, Punjab, was established in July 2021 with the joining of Dr. M. Altaf Mir as Associate Professor on 27th of July 2021.
- (b) The Department is rapidly increasing the spectrum of reconstruction and undertaking the major reconstruction surgeries in head and neck cancer patients, hand and lower limb injuries, post skin malignancy defects, oculoplastic surgery, and almost all the congenital and acquired defects and deformities of anatomical body parts.
- (c) Micro-vascular tissue transfers like free Flaps, repair of nerve and vessel injuries, Brachial plexus surgery, cleft and craniofacial surgeries, and lymphedema surgery are being routinely done. Corrective surgeries and rehabilitation of post-burn deformity, post-burn scarring, and limb deformity are done. Pediatric Congenital deformities like syndactyly, polydactyly, hypospadias, cleft lip-palate, and club hand are being corrected. Aesthetic Surgeries like otoplasty, rhinoplasty, abdominoplasty, breast reduction, gynecomastia correction, and scar revision are being done. A minor surgical procedure room has been set up in the outpatient clinic and in the Burns & Plastic Surgery Ward.
- (d) The Department is planning to establish a microvascular training lab for teaching and training of residents and the establishment of a dedicated 55-bedded Burn unit with modern facilities, with HDU and a dedicated Burn OT (under CSR) for the care of Acute Burn patients in the near future.
- (e) The Department has already started M.Ch. Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery and M. Ch in Hand and Microvascular Surgery. The post-doctoral certificate course (PDCC), with two seats per year in Hand Surgery, is also approved. The department has also started short (3month) and long (6-month) observer-ship courses in Hand and Brachial Plexus surgery, and Maxillofacial surgery.
- (f) The department is planning to start a 6-year course in Plastic and reconstructive Surgery and a Post-doctoral fellowship in Cleft and Craniofacial Surgery in the near future.

The Department of Cardiology is focused on providing HOLISTIC CARDIOVASCULAR care in all its domains, viz clinical cardiology, diagnostic cardiology, and interventional cardiology. Presently, we are covering the whole spectrum of cardiovascular diseases including Coronary artery diseases, Heart failure, cardiac arrhythmias, and Preventive cardiology for risk stratification,

Apart from routine cardiology services, we have started CARDIAC REHABILITATION PROGRAM, which involves YOGA care, predischarge counselling in the cardiology ward, and regular cardiac awareness lectures in the cardiology OPD/ main reception area premises.







The Department of Microbiology of AIIMS Bathinda is providing diagnostic facilities for various infectious diseases. The Department was functioning with COVID-19 RT-PCR lab and new facility for bacterial culture and rapid diagnosis of viral markers was started in July, 2022. 2. <u>Brief Introduction of the department</u>. We have started Haemodialysis services since 8th of October 2022. So far more than 2000 Haemodialysis sessions have been undertaken. Continuous renal replacement therapy (CRRT) is also functional in the unit and so far 12 patients have undergone successful CRRT in critically ill state in various ICUs. We are also providing bedside Slow Low Efficiency Dialysis in all the four ICUs AIIMS, Bathinda have. Plasmapharesis is being conducted in Dialysis unit for Gullian Barre Syndrome, CIDP, AMSAN, Myasthenia gravis, and severe acute hepatitis. SO far more than 200 sessions of Plasmapharesis sessions have been conducted successfully. Our Interventional Nephrology program is on full swing. We have conducted Handson Workshop of CAPD catheter insertion where in DM students from various neighbouring medical colleges have participated. We also provide Dialysis access creation to CKD end stage patients viz. Tunnelled cuffed catheter placement, CAPD catheter placement, AVF creation, Femoral Catheter placement and Access correction surgeries. We have performed 350 Kidney Biopsies since the initiation of nephrology services (Sept 2021). We have provided technical inputs to initiate Pradhan mantri National Dialysis Programme- CAPD to DMRE, State of Punjab.

We have a state of art facility for doing Electroencephalography (EEG), Nerve conduction studies (NCS), Electromyography (EMG). We have Video EEG machine (Nihon Kohden Neuropack) and one NCS/EMG machine, 8 channel machine to record evoked potentials (Natus). The lab is run by experienced technical staff under the supervision of the faculty. Routine as well as special neurophysiological studies are undertaken in the department. The appointments for EEG/ NCS/ EMG studies are obtained from Neurology staff.

IN-PATIENTS DEPARTMENT:

The department caters to the need of serious patients by admitting them. We also admit patients with diagnostic dilemma.

II. Brief Introduction of the department:

Nuclear Medicine is a super-specialty branch of Medicine that is based on Imaging physiological / metabolic changes of the various disease processes and thus characterise them at a much earlier stage as compared to Conventional imaging Modalities such as USG, X-Ray, IVP, CT scan, MRI, etc.

The branch deals with the use of unsealed / open radio-active tracers to provide information about the functions of specific organ at molecular level (Diagnostic Nuclear Medicine) and treatment of various diseases (Targeted Radio-nuclide therapy) like Hyperthyroidism and thyroid cancers using Radio-iodine (I-131), Metastatic Neuroendocrine tumors using Lu-177 DOTATATE (Peptide Receptor Radionuclide Therapy - PRRT), metastatic castration resistant prostatic cancers using Lu-177/Ac-225 PSMA, neural crest tumors like neuroblastoma using I-131 MIBG, HCC with Y-90 microspheres, Targeted Alfa therapies with Ac-225, Metastatic bone pain palliation (P-32, Sm-153 EDTMP etc.), radiation synovectomy etc.

Nuclear Medicine Department provides the diagnostic services with the use of PET/CT, SPECT/CT and Thyroid Uptake Probe & Well Counter System machines.

Infrastructure:

The Department is located in the Basement 2 of IPD block. As per the AERB approved Site Layout Map, space is available for installation of state-of-the-art PET/CT, SPECT/CT and Thyroid Uptake Probe Systems along with the provision for administering Low-Dose Iodine Therapy.

Services:

- 1. Installation of state-of-the-art PET machine received through CSR funds by the ONGC Ltd is on-going and it is expected that in-house PET-CT scan services will start in next coming 2-3 months.
- 2. Installation of state-of-the-art Thyroid Uptake Probe System with Well Counter is on-going and it is expected that in-house Radioactive Iodine Uptake Studies (RAIU) in thyrotoxicosis patients will start in next coming 2-3 months.
- 3. Low-Dose Iodine Therapy for patients of Graves Disease, Toxic MNG and AFTN will be available after the installation of Thyroid Uptake Probe System.
- 4. Special clinic (Thyroid Clinic) was started in Feb 2024.
- 5. Review of outside PET/CT scan is done on regular basis.
- 6. To help the patients Appointments for various types of scans that are done on SPECT-CT (Gamma Camera) and PET-CT machines is arranged at PGIMER, Chandigarh.



Vision:

- 1. Recruitment of Additional Faculty on priority basis.
- 2. To get approval for the procurement and installation of state-of-the-art SPECT/CT scan services in near future.
- 3. For starting of IPD services To get approval for construction of new building so as to start Targeted Radio-nuclide therapy in various malignancies.








Figure 4- Orator for Prof. R. P. Chaudhary Oration at Lalitpur, Nepal

VI. Brief Introduction of the department:

The Department of Psychiatry started functioning after the inauguration of the outpatient services at AIIMS, Bathinda w.e.f. 23-12-2020. The faculty manpower consisted of four faculty members namely Dr. Gurvinder Pal Singh as Prof and HOD, Dr. Jitender Aneja, Additional Professor and Dr. Bharat Udey, Associate Professor and Dr. Jawahar Singh Associate professor.

Broadly we are catering to children, adolescents, adults and elderly patients with psychological issues or psychiatric disorders, substance use disorders and sexual disorders. In our outdoor clinic we are serving to patients with common mental disorders, severe mental illness, psychosomatic disorders, stress related problems, childhood disorders, geriatric problems, substance use disorders, marital and psychosexual disorders etc. We are seeing new patients as well as referred patients from other departments of AIIMS Bathinda and outside. We are providing pharmacotherapy, and psychological testing (presently limited) and therapies like psychoeducation, behavioral therapy, psychotherapy, abreaction treatments and teaching various relaxation exercises.

Special clinics being run are: Drug Deaddiction Clinic (DDC) (Tuesday), Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Clinic (CAPC) (Monday), Geriatric Mental Health Clinic (GMHC) (Wednesday), Marital & Psychosexual Clinic (MPC; Wednesday), and Mindfulness skill clinic (Thursday).

II. Brief Introduction of the department:

The Department of Pulmonary Medicine is dedicated to becoming a center of excellence in the field of respiratory medicine, critical care, and sleep disorders, particularly serving the Malwa region. Our vision is to offer advanced, innovative, and cost-effective respiratory care that is both accessible and compassionate. With a strong focus on clinical excellence and patient-centered services, we aim to set new benchmarks in quality healthcare delivery.

The department addresses a wide spectrum of chest and respiratory conditions, including bronchial asthma, allergic bronchopulmonary aspergillosis (ABPA), chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), pneumonia, tuberculosis, pleural diseases, lung cancer, pulmonary hypertension, pulmonary embolism, pulmonary vasculitis, occupational lung diseases, interstitial lung diseases, sleep disorders, and respiratory failure. Our clinical approach is comprehensive, integrating accurate diagnosis with personalized treatment strategies tailored to the needs of each patient.

We currently offer a range of diagnostic and interventional procedures such as percutaneous FNAC and lung biopsies, tube thoracostomy, pleural biopsies, chemical pleurodesis, pulmonary function tests (PFT), cardiopulmonary exercise testing (CPET), six-minute walk test (6MWT), sleep studies, thoracic ultrasonography, bronchoscopic BAL, TBLB, Endobronchial Biopsies, Radial EBUS guided TBLB and endobronchial ultrasound-guided transbronchial needle aspiration (EBUS-TBNA). Looking ahead, the department plans to expand its clinical offerings to include fractional exhaled nitric oxide (FeNO) testing, body plethysmography, DLCO, medical thoracoscopy, and rigid bronchoscopy. These additions will further enhance our diagnostic and therapeutic capabilities, allowing us to manage complex pulmonary conditions more effectively.

In parallel with our clinical mission, the department is deeply committed to academic excellence. We are actively involved in the training of undergraduate and postgraduate students in pulmonary medicine and sleep disorders. In line with our vision for academic growth, we are also working towards the initiation of a DM program in Pulmonary Critical Care and Sleep Medicine, which will serve to build future leaders in this specialized field.





II. Brief Introduction of the department:

The department specialises in complex abdominal surgeries, including luminal gastrointestinal, hepatobiliary, and pancreatic procedures. Gastrointestinal oncology constitutes a core focus area, accounting for approximately 55-60% of cases managed within the department. Particular emphasis is placed on minimally invasive (laparoscopic) surgery and the treatment of gastrointestinal cancers. The faculty possesses significant expertise in complex laparoscopic procedures, which are preferred for the majority of both benign and malignant conditions.

The department aspires to become a centre of excellence for laparoscopic surgery and is committed to advancing safe laparoscopic training for surgeons across Punjab and neighbouring states. Ongoing collaboration with surgeons and gastroenterologists in adjacent regions ensures adherence to safe surgical practices and facilitates timely referral of patients requiring specialised care. As a result, the department is increasingly recognised as the preferred centre for managing complicated surgeries and addressing complications from procedures performed elsewhere.

In addition, comprehensive care for digestive diseases is provided through integrated services that encompass Surgical and Medical Gastroenterology, dietetics and nutrition, stoma care, and patient counselling. Over the past year, the department has performed more than 270 major or supramajor surgeries, more than 550 endoscopies and more than 650 fibro scans. The recent introduction of laparoscopic liver surgeries places the department among a select group of centres nationally capable of offering such advanced procedures via a minimally invasive approach. It has also established itself as a high-volume centre for liver, biliary, and pancreatic surgeries, attracting referrals from surrounding states.

The prestigious M.Ch. super-specialty programme in Surgical Gastroenterology commenced with the induction of its first resident in the May 2025 session. Faculty members are actively engaged in research and co-supervise numerous postgraduate theses.



- (a) The real time HMIS streamlines the treatment flow of patients and simultaneously empowering workforce to perform to their peak ability, in an optimized and efficient manner. It is modeled on the unique combination of a 'patient centric and medical staff centric' paradigm, thus providing benefits to both the recipients and the providers of healthcare. It ensures dramatic improvement in performance along with reducing the costs. A data warehouse of such records can be utilized for statistical requirements and for research.
- (b) The HMIS ensures that users do not spend hours in patient registration and lab tests. Hospital HMIS system generates a unique ID for every new patient registration and lab samples. Patients OPD slip has a unique ID on it and only takes seconds to scan and offer hospital services like revisits, billing, pharmacy services etc. Each patient after OPD registration moves to vital examination desk. On the vital examination desk trained health personnel who measure pulse, respiration, and blood pressure of patients.



MRD: OPD SERVICES

- 1. Multi-specialty OPD services aim to providing patient centric care were started in the specialty areas of General Medicine, Surgery, Gynecology& Obstetrics, Orthopedics, ENT, Ophthalmology, Dermatology, Psychiatry, Dentistry, Radiotherapy, and Anesthesiology which are functioning from Monday to Saturday. The clinics focus on the preventive, promotive and curative aspect of health care services on an outpatient basis. Immunization clinic has also been started with support from the state Government to provide vaccines under the Universal Immunization Program by Government of India.
- 2. The hospital brings together some of the most talented medical professionals in the country and has a dedicated team of clinicians to provide highest standards of patient care. There is provision of consultation chambers where patients are provided medical, surgical or allied consultation, examination and expert opinion, Day care rooms where patients can be examined for any disease condition.
- The OPD is supported by basic diagnostics in radiology, biochemistry, pathology, and microbiology and sample collection points have been provided. Pharmacy provides medications to the patients. The biomedical waste management at AIIMS Bathinda has been out sourced.









GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF VARIOUS SERVICES

Biochemistry: Investigation panel includes routine biochemical tests, thyroid function tests,

hormones, vitamin assays, and others.

Microbiology: Investigations include serological tests, screening for STDs, immunological tests,

bacteriological cultures, and viral markers.

Pathology: Investigations include routine hematological indices, cytology, histopathology, Leukemia testing, Bone marrow examination, Immunohistochemistry, Immunopathology (ANA).

AMRIT pharmacy employs registered pharmacist to dispense the medicines. The Pharmacists follow the procedures prescribed in Dispensing Pharmacy Discipline. They ensure that, the right patient is served, a desired dosage form of the correct drug is given, the prescribed dosage and quantity are given, the right container that maintains the potency of the drugs is used, the container is appropriately labelled, and clear instructions have been delivered to the patient. The Standard dispensing procedure followed by Pharmacists. Along with the Drug dispensing procedures, pharmacists follow a store level process that involves, computerized real time data and some manual interventions.


- 3. <u>Major Services and Developments of the IT Cell.</u>
 - Platforms that are implemented by IT Cell are mentioned below: -
- (a) <u>Queue Management System (QMS)</u>. The IT Cell has designed and developed the queue management system for the management of patient's queue for various departments in the hospital. QMS is running on the LED displays installed in OPD Block. The QMS system is bilingual and works in both English as well as Punjabi language. QMS can also function on a room-wise basis, enabling efficient management of queues and patient flow within specific rooms.







- (b) <u>Google Workspace</u>. In addition to the website & QMS, IT cell has been providing mail services through G Suite (Google Workspace). The extension of this service has enabled the use of Google Classrooms as a basic LMS service for the departments in the campus. File sharing and recording of lecture is available in this platform. Various apps are available through workspace such as Gmail, Google calendar, Meet, Assignments, Forms and sheets etc.
- (c) <u>Microsoft Teams</u>. Online classes, Assignments can be taken through MS Teams. Faculty can interact one to one as well as with whole class using Teams as well as email with Microsoft account. File sharing and recording of lecture is available in this platform. Data storage of 1 TB per account is given by Administration to store, transfer data such as video lectures, assignments, photographs etc.



(d) Learning Management System from RailTel. On Pilot basis, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, selected AIIMS Bathinda and AIIMS Raebareli to implement Learning Management System (LMS) and this software will be used to digitize all the academic records for students & faculty through a single integrated platform. The proposed platform would also cater the needs of online learning/e-learning for on Campus and Remote Students (Learning Support Platform) across the medical institute. OIC IT is the Nodal officer for the implementation of the LMS at AIIMS Bathinda.





- (e) <u>Hospital Management Information System (HMIS)</u>. HMIS called eSushrut has started functioning from day-one of beginning of the OPD services and is a major step towards adapting technology to improve healthcare. This HMIS incorporates an integrated computerized clinical information system for improved hospital administration and patient health care. It also provides an accurate, electronically stored medical record (EMR) of the patient. An Electronic Health Record (EHR) is an electronic version of a patient's longitudinal health record. EHR may contain medical history, diagnosis, medications, treatment plans, immunization dates, allergies and test results of a patient across time. Modules which are currently working in HMIS are: -








- (h) <u>eoffice</u>. The eOffice at AIIMS Bathinda has been successfully implemented. All the files are being routed through eOffice only. The OIC IT Cell is the Nodal Office for the implementation of eOffice.
 - (i) <u>eSanjeevani OPD</u>. A doctor to patient telemedicine system has been deployed nationally by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare under Ayushman Bharat Scheme of Government of India. The scheme is particularly useful during times of pandemic Covid-19 as it helps people avoid going out to consult a doctor or visit a hospital. Through eSanjeevani OPD, anyone can seek medical advice and medication through audio and video. With the introduction ofthis service, people living in the remotest areas will also be able to get their health-related consultation. AIIMS Bathinda started Teleconsultation using portal eSanjeevani OPD. Admin Panel in which newentries of doctors for various departments, record updation is maintained by IT Cell.



(i) Online OPD Registration. Online Registration System (ORS) is a framework to link various hospitals across the country for Aadhaar based online registration and appointment system where counter based OPD registration and appointment system through Hospital Management Information System (HMIS) has been digitalized. Portal facilitates online appointments with various departments of different Hospitals using eKYC data of Aadhaar number if patient's mobile number is registered with UIDAI. And in case the mobile number is not registered with UIDAI it uses patient's name. New Patients will get appointment as well as Unique Health Identification (UHID) number. If Aadhaar number is already linked with UHID number, then appointment number will be given and UHID will remain the same. AIIMS Bathinda started online appointment using ORS portal. Admin Panel in which new entries of doctors for various departments, OPD schedule, record updation is maintained by IT Cell.






(j) <u>IT Ticket Desk.</u> The IT Cell at AIIMS Bathinda has made a significant contribution to the enhancement of technical support services within the institution by developing a comprehensive Ticket Desk Software. The end users can now raise ticket if they want any kind of IT related support from IT Cell. Separate ticket number will be generated for every request. This innovative solution is designed to provide transparent, efficient and effective technical support to both hospital services and administrative functions, thereby streamlining operations and improving overall productivity.

Key Features of the Ticket Desk Software:

- Centralized Ticket Management System: The software enables users to raise tickets for technical issues or support requests, which are then tracked and managed in a centralized system.
- Prioritization and Categorization: Tickets are prioritized and categorized based on their urgency and nature, ensuring that critical issues are addressed promptly and efficiently.
- **Real-time Tracking:** Users can track the status of their tickets in real-time, providing transparency and accountability throughout the support process.





- 4. <u>Network</u>. AIIMS Bathinda signed MoU with the National Knowledge Network (NKN) for the internet connectivity and 1 GBPS internet link is working in AIIMS Bathinda. OIC IT is the nodal officer and IT Cell is coordinating with the NKN regarding the network related works. BSNL also serves as both the ISP and PRI provider, with the IT Cell serving as the nodal department and also overseeing day-to-day coordination with the relevant department for related tasks.
- 5. <u>Firewall & Network Devices</u>. The IT Cell is responsible for the management and oversight of critical network devices, including firewalls, ISRs, PRIME, and WLC. IT Cell ensures the seamless operation of network services by handling configuration and policy-based tasks.
- 6. <u>Cybersecurity Measures.</u> OIC IT is appointed as Chief Information Security officer (CISO) at AIIMS Bathinda. IT Cell is managing cybersecurity measures such as Log monitoring, EDR (Endpoint Detection and Response), FortiAuthenticator etc. IT Cell is coordinating with the various agencies regarding the cyber security measures like Cert-In, NCIIPC etc.
- 7. <u>Biometric Register</u>. The IT Cell has successfully engineered a specialized software application with the primary purpose of converting the raw data generated by our biometric machines into a format compatible with our biometric register system. This innovative solution streamlines the process of recording and managing biometric data, making it more accessible and convenient for administrative purposes. By seamlessly integrating raw data into the biometric register, this application enhances the efficiency of record-keeping procedures.
- 8. <u>Email Services</u>. AIIMS Bathinda is using NIC Email services under the domain 'aiimsbathinda.edu.in'. OIC IT is the nodal officer for the same and IT Cell is operating admin panel of NIC Email services. Services like creation of new email account, deactivation of account etc. along with the renewal of VPN and email services subscription is operated and maintained by the IT Cell. Additionally, Google workspace services under the domain 'aiimsbathinda.in' is subscripted by the AIIMS Bathinda from Google and google email services along with the admin panel is also managed and operated by the IT Cell.
- 9. <u>Video Conferencing (VC) Room</u>. Set up for the video conferencing is installed in ground floor of Medical College, AIIMS Bathinda by IT Cell using various devices such as LED Display (12*6 Feet), Video End Point, Microphones etc. Administration is using this VC room for videos conferences such as meetings, lectures, interviews on various platforms like google meet, cisco Webex, Zoom, Microsoft Teams etc.
- 10. <u>Telemedicine Room</u>. A telemedicine room has been set up in the ground floor of IPD by the IT Cell and all the equipment's required for the video conferencing such as 85 Inch Display, PC, Microphones and Web camera has been installed in that room. This room is equipped to roll out the eSanjeevani services in AIIMS Bathinda. This room is additionally equipped to facilitate consultants in appearing before the court virtually at AIIMS Bathinda.
- 11. <u>Data Center</u>. The IT Cell has successfully procured the essential equipment for the inhouse data center at AIIMS Bathinda, and the installation has been completed. The critical Hospital Information Management System (eSushrut) is now being hosted effectively from AIIMS Bathinda's in-house data center, with the IT Cell responsible for managing its services.
- 12. <u>Procurement in IT Store</u>. The IT Cell has procured IT-related equipment and items through both the GeM portal and direct purchasing channels. This strategic procurement approach ensures that our organization has access to the necessary technological resources including consumables and non-consumables required for optimal functionality.



13. Technical support for CPC-CGR PG session and other Academic activities.

The IT Cell is providing crucial technical support for the smooth conduct of these academic sessions, ensuring seamless execution. The IT Cell's support included:

- (a) Technical assistance for online lectures and workshops.
- (b) Maintenance of digital platforms and infrastructure.
- (c) Troubleshooting technical issues and providing prompt solutions.





SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Schedule - 24

Introduction:

All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Bathinda (Punjab) is a Central autonomous body under the aegis of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare under the PMSSY Division. A Gazette Notification was issued on 04th Dec 2019 for the establishment of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences at Bathinda in Punjab. The Government of Punjab transferred land measuring 179.27 acres to the Central Government for the establishment of AllMS Bathinda.

The PGIMER, Chandigarh, was the mentor institute of AlIMS, Bathinda, and the OPD/IPD services of the Institute have been started.

1. Accounting Convention

The books of accounts of All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Bathinda (Punjab) have been maintained on the basis of Accrual basis of accounting.

2. Inventory Valuation

The Inventory of the Institute, i.e. stores & spares consumables, has been valued at cost price. The costs have been worked out on the First in First Out (FIFO) method.

3. Fixed Assets

- 3.1. Fixed Assets are stated at historical cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental expenses relating to acquisition. In respect of projects involving construction, related preoperational expenses (including interest on loans for specific project prior to its completion), form part of the value of the assets capitalized.
- 3.2. Fixed assets received by way of non-monetary grants (other than towards the Corpus Fund), are capitalized at values stated, by corresponding credit to Capital Reserve/Corpus Fund.





3.3. Fixed Assets received from the project Funds (HEFA & MOHFW) by the PSA are capitalized as per the installation/assessment in the Institute.

4. Depreciation

- 4.1. The depreciation has been provided in the books of accounts as per the W.D.V. method and rates specified are as per the Income Tax Act, 1961.
- 4.2. In respect of addition/deletion of assets during the year, are charged on half of the rate, where the addition/ deletion is less than six months and full rate of depreciation is charged, where the period exceeded six months.

5. Ayushman

5.1. Receipts from the State Health Agencies are accounted for as Income & corresponding exp. towards consumables are accounted for as expenditure.

2. Investment & Deposits

The funds available in the Bank accounts are kept in Corporate Liquid Term Deposit (CLTD) mode. However, The Ministry has implemented the Treasury Single Account (TSA) system, wherein the funds are being transferred to the beneficiaries directly from the RBI account through PFMS.

3. Interest Accrued but not due

The Interest accrued but not due comes to Rs. 2.51 Cr. as on 31.03.2025 (Refer Sch 11.B).

4. Taxation

As the Institute income is exempted from Income Tax under Section 10(23c)(iii)(ab)of Income tax Act 1961, therefore no provision of income tax has been made.

5. Expenditure Payable (Provision)

A provision for expenses payable to the tune of Rs. 49.29 Cr. has been made as on 31.03.2025 (Refer Schedule 7(B), this includes salary & other expenses.

6. Current Assets, Loans and Advances

Current assets, loans and advances have been stated in the balance sheet on an actual transaction basis.

7. Secured Loans & Borrowings-

A term loan of Rs. 525 Cr. sanctioned by HEFA vide reference no. SAN/AllMS/Bathinda/246/2018-19, the payable to HEFA has been paid fully in (21-22) financial year.

8. Retirement and Other employee's Benefits

The provision for leave encashment and gratuity of Rs. 8.09 Cr. for the current financial year has been made, and that of previous years of Rs. 10.04 Cr. is made out of the corpus funds, based on the Actuarial valuation report.

9. Capital Fund (Donation/CSR, etc.)

During the financial year 2024-25, Rs. 42.35 Cr. have been received from ONGC for PET CT and LINAC as Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR).

10. Foreign Currency Transactions

During the year, the Institute has not entered into any foreign currency transactions.

12. Fixed Assets

- a.) The capitalization of Assets for the establishment of the AIIMS Bathinda Project, funded by MoHFW to PSA, has been considered only as per the details made available.
- b.) Buildings amounting to Rs. 86.91 crore were taken over on 23.12.2019 and amounting to Rs. 497.70 crore on 30.04.2022, after assessment by the Institute.
- c.) The Government of Punjab has allotted 179.27 acres, and the same has been shown in Fixed Assets (Schedule-8) at a nominal value of Rs. 1.00.



- d.) Patient Attendant Shelter home is being constructed by Dwarka Dass Mittal Charitable Trust, Bathinda, on the Institute's land (4000 square meters) under the supervision of the Institute.
- 13. An amount of Rs 11.28,000/- related to the current financial year towards water and air license fee given to the Punjab pollution control board (for 5 years) in FY 21-22 and Rs 34.74,633/- related to the firewall has been charged to Income and Exp A/c.
- 14. The interest earned on grant funds for FY 21-22 for Rs 81,45,088/- is deposited into the Consolidated Fund of India.
- 15. Schedules 1 to 25 are annexed to and form an integral part of the Balance Sheet as at 31.03.2025 and the Income and Expenditure Account for the year ended on that date.
- 16. Financial Statement and schedules have been compiled as per the Uniform Format of Accounts for Central Autonomous Bodies and other AlIMS-like Institutes.
- 17. As the Treasury Single Account has been implemented in the institute, therefore, recurring grants and provisions of the Institute have been charged to the Income and Expenditure Account.
- 18. The low-value items/consumables received in the donation/ Free of cost are used for patient care and not shown in the books of accounts, as the value of the items may not be ascertained, and invoices are not provided.

In this connection, the Institute has capitalised assets procured out of sponsored projects fund during the year 2024-25 amounting ₹11.64 lakh shown under Fixed Assets schedule (Sch-8). However, assets procured during previous years have not been shown in the fixed assets schedule. Further, no disclosure have been made regarding the ownership of these assets in the Notes on Accounts (Sch-25).

B. Management Letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in this Separate Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Management through a Management Letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

C. Assessment of Internal Controls

C.1 Adequacy of Internal Audit System

Internal audit is being conducted by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, GOI, Office of Chief Controller of Accounts, Central Internal Audit Party, Chandigarh. No records pertaining to Internal Audit Wing in the Institute was found available in the records. The Last audit was conducted in the year 2023 for the period starting from the establishment of the Institute to 2021-22

C.2 Adequacy of Internal Control System

Internal control system of the Institute was found deficient to the extent that no meeting of Governing Body was held during 2024-25 against the prescribed norm of at least three meetings a year preferably in the month of January, May and September.

C.3 Physical Verification of Fixed Assets and library books

The annual Physical verification of fixed assets for the period 2024-25 was completed on 14.08.2025. Further, the Physical verification of Library books 2024-25 was also under progress at the time of audit.

C.4 Physical Verification of Inventory/stock

The annual Physical verification of Inventory for the period 2024-25 was not conducted.



C.5 Regularity in payment of statutory dues

The statutory dues has been regularly paid by the All-India Institute of Medical Sciences, Bathinda.
