All India Institute of Medical sciences Bathinda has organised a medical camp at Civil Hospital Bathinda on 23 /9/2025 as per the initiative taken by Government of India 'Swashth Nari Sashakt Parivar Abhiyaan 2025. The mega camp was graced by the honourable President AIIMS Dr Neerja Bhatla and Executive Director Dr Meenu Singh. The camp was lead by Professor and Head Dr Lajya Devi Goyal, Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology AIIMS Bathinda. The aim of holding the medical camp was to screen adolescent girls, antenatal women and women in reproductive and post menopausal age group, especially targeting diseases like anaemia, complications related to pregnancy, pre- cancerous cervical lesions and obesity. The team for this medical camp included Dr. Manjit Kaur Rana, Dr. Balpreet Kaur, Dr. Mandeep Kaur, Dr. Priyanka Singh, Dr. Navpreet Mehra, Dr. Mansi, Ms. Manpreet and Mr. Sanjeev from AIIMS Bathinda. The benefeciaries who attended the camp were around 300.

Honourable President AIIMS Dr Neerja Bhatla had addressed the gathering laying emphasis on importance of HPV Vaccination in young adolescent girls, adequate nutrition before and during pregnancy, importance of regular antenatal check-ups, need for cervical cancer screening through pap smear in women. Dr Meenu Singh highlighted that a healthy motherhood is a key to a healthy baby and an empowered family. Dr Singh further reiterated the services available at AIIMS Bathinda ranging from blood investigations to advanced procedures like treatment of cancers.

Dr Lajya Devi Goyal maintained that Department of Obs and Gynae at AIIMS Bathinda is catering the high risk Obstetrics cases with very promising outcome, asserting that high risk pregnancies identified at Civil hospital be attached to AIIMS Bathinda for further management.

The team from AIIMS had made all necessary arrangements for collection of blood samples for Anaemia screening, Pap smear testing, screening of antenatal women, newborns and children. Medicines like iron and folic acid tablets, anti helminthic drugs, calcium supplements, multivitamins, necessary antibiotics were provided to the patients by AIIMS.

After screening, the patients requiring tertiary level care will be further managed at AIIMS Bathinda.

AIIMS will be organising a similar camp at Civil hospital in the following week in collaboration with a team from Civil Hospital.
